



Common Name: Valley oak

Scientific Name: *Quercus lobata*

This tree, growing at a bed and breakfast in Genoa, was nominated by Linda Sanfilippo and Jim Ross in 2001, (shown being measured by Greg Pyatt).

It measures 100 feet high, with a trunk circumference of 172 inches and a trunk diameter of 4 feet; it has a crown spread of 101 feet for a total of 297 points.

Valley oak is native to California.

This tree may have been planted at the same time the structure was built around 1861.
